Tips for Reading with Your Children

Birth to 2 Years Old Reading = Snuggling!

Read for short periods with your child on your lap or next to you. Being close to you is likely as important as the reading!

2 to 3 Years Old Flip it!

Have your child open the cover and turn the pages of the book while you read.

Ask questions!

Ask your child simple questions about the book. Examples: What was your favorite part of the book? Where did Corduroy go when he explored the store?

3 to 5 Years Old Think about it!

Ask your child questions about the characters of the story that require predicting, imagining, or making inferences. Examples: How do you think Madeline feels right now? If you were Peter Rabbit, what would you do?

Read it!

Encourage your child to read common words. Example: This word, t-h-e, is the. Help me read "the" when you see it in the book.
